

MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING  
ON THE 85.21 SPECIALIZED TRANSPORTATION ASSISTANCE GRANT  
FROM THE WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION  
HELD ON FRIDAY, DECEMBER 10, 2010  
AT THE VILAS COUNTY COURTHOUSE  
EAGLE RIVER, WISCONSIN

The Public Hearing was opened at 9:00 a.m. by the Commission on Aging Vice-Chairperson, Mary Platner. The following members of the community were present: Shirley Haws, Kris Main, Robert Myers, Mary Platner, Fred Radtke, Danielle Montgomery, Chris Wise and June Wedell. Other interested parties were: Joe Fortmann and Susan Richmond.

This Public Hearing was posted and listed in the Vilas News Review and Lakeland Times. Copies of the proposed 2011 Specialized Transportation Assistance 85.21 Grant were available for review.

Fortmann led the Hearing and read through Section E and the proposed budgets of each project. The amount for each project was discussed by the members with the total grant being \$92,431.00.

Wedell questioned how the funding was distributed and if S.E.R.V.E. was the only project with paid drivers. Haws also questioned who determines the fares for each project and if someone wanted to ride the bus, but did not have the funds to pay the fare, could the Club pay for them and still give them the ride. Richmond responded that the Commission on Aging does not have anything to do with setting the fares, but the projects should try to stay as close as they can to the Section E that is included in the Application and yes, the Clubs could pay for someone who cannot afford the fare.

There being no further comment, Haws made a motion and Myers seconded the motion to close the Public Hearing at 9:18 a.m.
